


Our righteous food truck is here to provide delicious food to our local community while empowering our fellow students to develop their culinary, social, and business skills and have fun while doing it!

Our Middle School events planning group has announced the theme for the next dance!




>>> POSITIVE BEHAVIOR REWARDS DRAWING
