

Your child's digital portfolio will be shared with you via Google Drive by November 6th. This portfolio contains a folder with each of their current courses and 1 work sample. New work samples will be added monthly.

#### >>> ADVISORY UPDATE

The purpose of advisory is to build a school family through activities that foster self reflection and an understanding of others. The 5 part structure of morning advisory is outlined below:

- Preview visual review of the day's schedule and announcements
- Greeting teacher and students acknowledge each other to continue to build rapport
- 3. Share students share something about themselves to deepen understanding and connection
- 4. Activity students engage in a shared purpose so they can continue to build their communication skills
- 5. Prep Moment helps students maintain their time, materials, and information before the day begins

### **ECO TIP**

If a child can do something, they should!

Examples include:

Sending emails, asking a question related to their schedule, advocating for support, expressing emotions

#### >>> CAREER & COLLEGE COUNSELING

This month seniors continued to work on their college applications during their Senior Seminar class, as well as in one-on-one meetings with Ryan Deery, Director of Career & Collegel Counseling. We are preparing several students to apply early to colleges, beginning as soon as November 1st!

In addition, parents have started filling out the CSS Profile:

The CSS Profile, administered and maintained by the College Board, the same group that develops the SAT, opens the door to nonfederal scholarships and other kinds of institutional aid that can make a big difference when it's time to pay for college.

Aiming to paint a fuller picture of a family's finances than the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, the CSS Profile offers opportunities for families to describe unique or extenuating circumstances that affect their ability to pay. (<u>USNews & World Report</u>)

Also this month, Windham Woods has developed a plan to offer a Postgraduate year option for students, beginning in the fall of 2024. The official rollout of this plan, including information about how to apply and the application process will be released in January!
